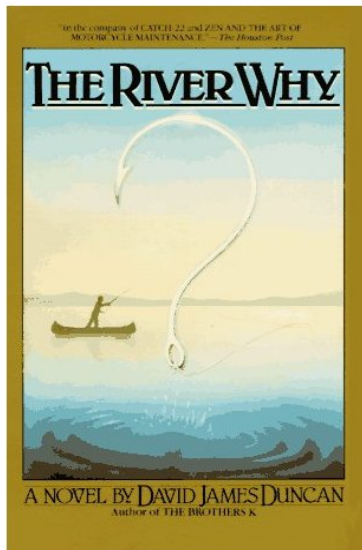

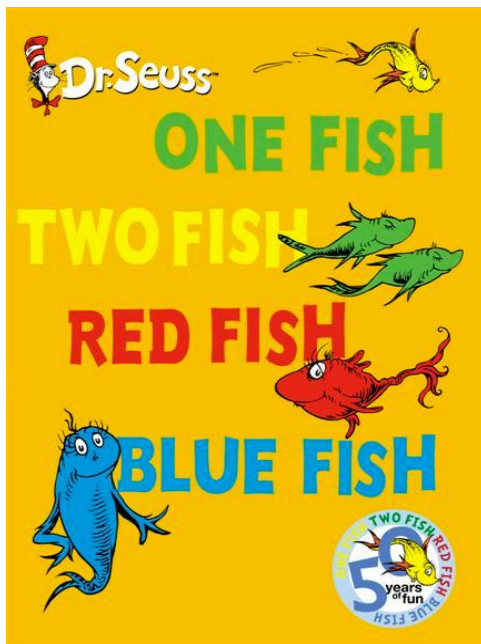

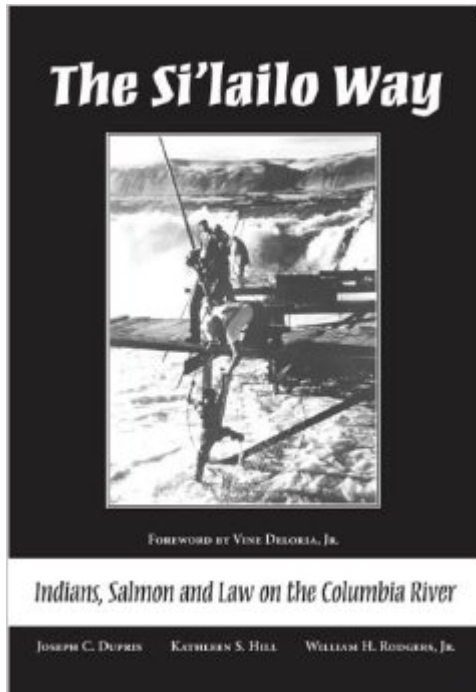


Children's Fiction

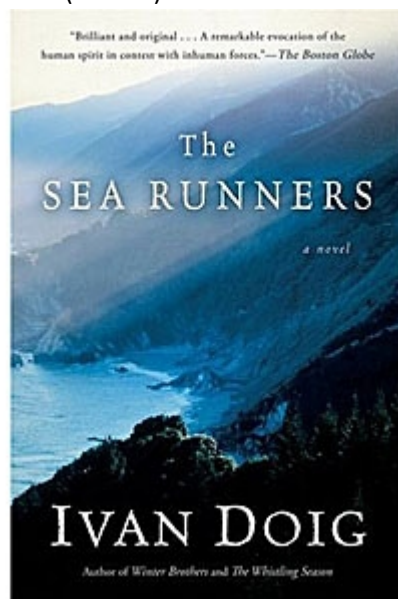

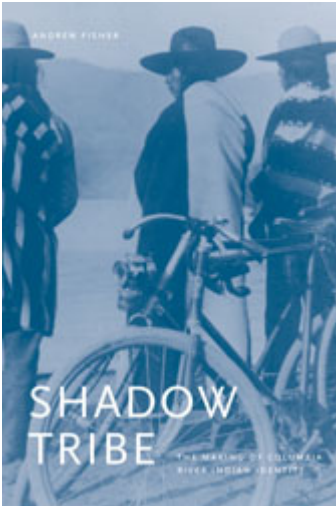


Why: A good fiction story about the coastal waters and the seagoing Indians. It was three men on a voyage and lost at sea.

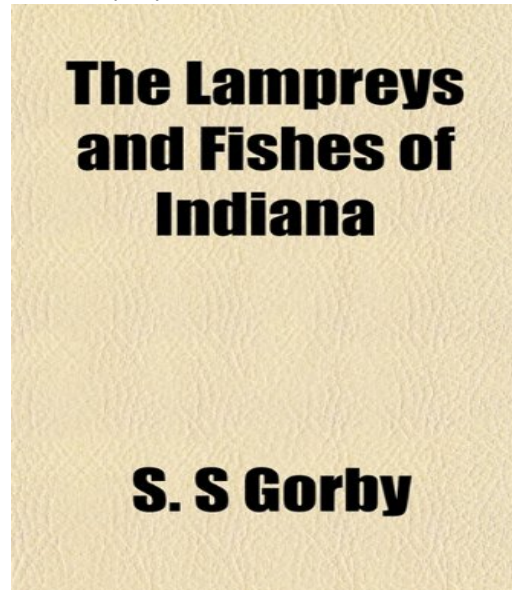
Why: 1<sup>st</sup> grade book that meant a lot to him. Through the eyes of a young tribal boy. It was the book that he first learned that the fish come back.

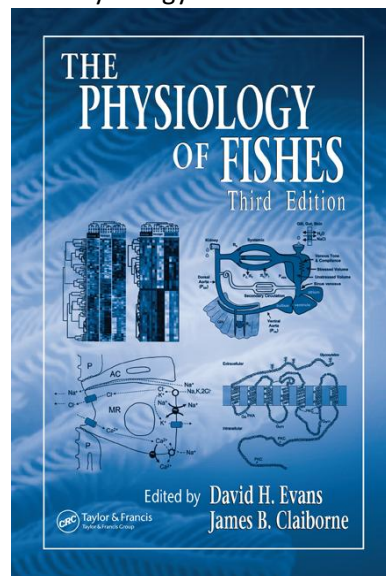

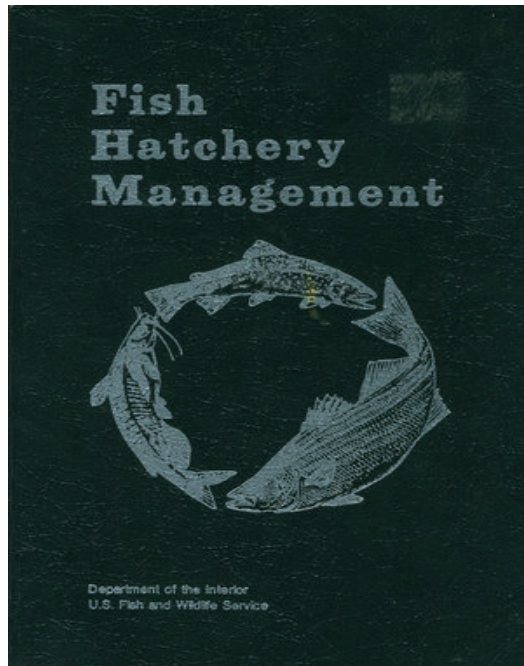

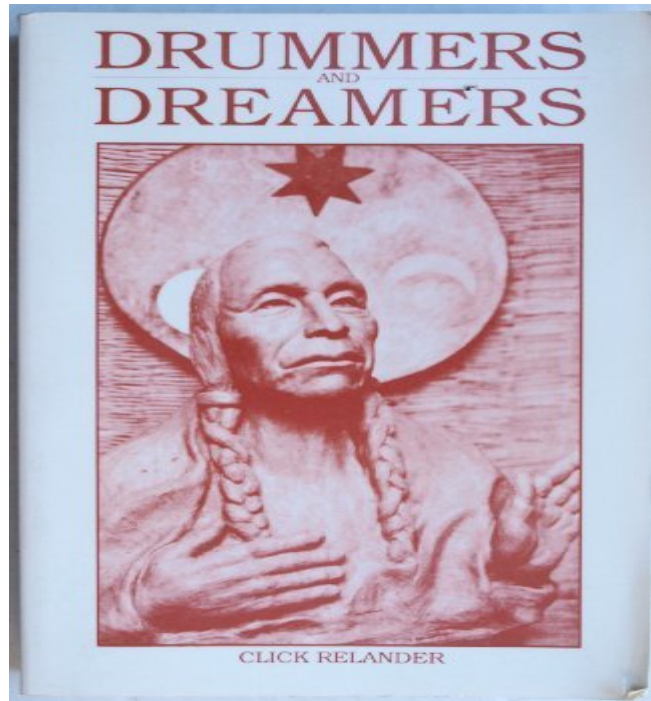
